Unfortunately the year started off with the club in a financial position it had not suffered in many years, with membership well below the maximum 62 members. The April 2015 General Meeting was a sombre one with **Treasurer Bill Glover** bringing in a budget based on revenue from only 57 members, slightly above the actual membership at that time and the Treasurer's Report stated *"there was no room for capital expenditures, and if unforeseen expenses arise members could be required to cover the cost through an additional levy."*

During the year Bill reported that the accounting had been transitioned from Simply Accounting to Quick Books and that more in-depth reports for the executive and the members would be available in the future.

It is with relief that the Treasurer's report at the end of the year will be full of great news — due to the fact that during the summer months the club membership actually grew to more members than docks and we again have a waiting list.

It would appear that *the best kept secret on the Great Lakes* was found out by the boating community with many new members coming to the club. The new members have often been younger, great for the future of the club. However, many of the new members have larger boats — possibly creating another unintended problem for **Fleet Captain—Al Thibert**, who has to provide docks as well as fall storage for all of the boats large and small — good luck Al.

Dan Hopkins— Rear Commodore for the past several years, continued to oversee the physical aspects of the club completing a number of maintenance items as well as having the old truck trailer storage structure dismantled by several club members and removed from the site. This not only removed an eyesore from the south storage compound but created new much needed parking.

6 Tips For Boating With Your Dog — by Galati Yacht Sales

Our four legged friends love going out on the boat almost as much as we do. Our dogs are part of the family and we need to insure that when they are on the water that we are prepared and they are safe. Here are six tips for boating with your dog



1. Invest in a life jacket. You may know that your dog is a good swimmer, but depending on conditions such as the current, they could face problems. Life jackets are especially recommended if you have a small dog or one that is not strong. You can purchase a dog life jacket from your local marine store, pet store, or online. Before you purchase a dog life jacket though, you should measure your dog's length, neck, and girth to ensure that you are purchasing the correct size. Once you purchased a doggie life vest be sure to have your dog try it on before you head out on the boat to ensure it fits correctly.

2. Bring extra water. The atmosphere out on the boat can be very hot and dry which is conducive to dehydration for dogs. Dogs do not sweat, so keep an eye out for heavy panting and a rapid heart beat. It is important that you take extra fresh water along for your dog and make sure that they have ample water available at all times. Collapsible dog water bowls are a good thing to have when out on the boat with your dog.

3. Take doggie waste bags or wee-wee pads. A big challenge of boating with your dog is making provisions so that they can go to the bathroom. If you can make stops to land then you should bring waste bags as a courtesy and pick up your dogs waste. If you are unable to make stops to land then you should train your dog to use wee-wee pads.

4. Bring a leash. You never know where you could end up when going out on the boat. So, it is always good to have a leash just in case you end up going to an island that has a leash law, a marina, or a restaurant. It is recommended though that you do not tie your dog to the deck, as it is not safe.

5. Bring treats for positive reinforcements. There are times such as docking and anchoring that you really need your dog to be well behaved and out of the way. Something you can do to help them is to give treats to help them to stay put while you are doing these tasks.

6. Develop a plan in case your dog goes overboard. While we hope this never happens, if it does you need to be prepared. You should talk to everyone on board so they will be prepared and know exactly what to do.

The \$3 million plus renovation is anticipated to be a new tourist attraction for the community, bringing back memories for many of the older club members as well as the surrounding population.

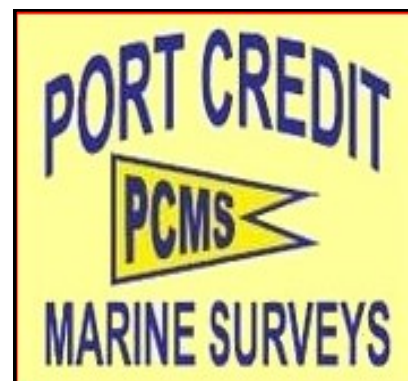
The continued development along the water way can only be a positive for tourism and the boating population, with the new boat launch ramp.



LOOKING FOR A NEW BOAT?

You are going to need a Survey for your peace of mind and probably for the insurance company. I found a good site on the web which has a wealth of information, it is **Port Credit Marine Surveys**, which has a section called Survey 101. Below are a couple of examples from the surveying overview. Even if you don't need a survey, many of the comments they make with pictures are good ideas to check into for your existing boat.

Don't forget one of the perks of KYC membership is a 10% discount at Stan's Marina if you need parts etc. for your boat.



Next boat

Look at the shorepower cord. Is the insulating cover abraded or brittle? If so replace it. See the little weld spots on the contact at right, that is caused by arcing i.e. electricity jumping across a small space, this will generate excessive heat and will melt down at some point..... replace the cord.

Never unplug a cord without opening the main circuit breakers As you wiggle the cord loose arcing will degrade the contact points and send your battery charger into a fit thereby shortening its life.



Next boat

Hoses - There are few things on a boat more neglected.

I cannot stress this enough ... Squeeze every hose on the boat ! The wet spots on the hose at right appeared when I squeezed the hose. I immediately closed the seacock or I'd be dealing with another sinker.

I think its kind of cute that he/she actually had tapered wooden plugs on hand.

PS. wear gloves when squeezing head hoses, then smell the gloves. I changed all my waste hoses to ABS pipe with only 6" hose connections at the toilet and tank. The ABS will last forever and never stink.
