As the season starts to slow and we enjoy the last of the club functions for 2017 I would like to thank all of the members who have supported the annual club projects, functions and the great crew of the Fish Fry for their hard work and successful season of events. We are all looking forward to Tony Morgan and the annual deck jam as well as the always phenomenal "pot luck".

As the Commodore and on behalf of the executive I would also like to thank the membership for keeping up the spirit of the club and camaraderie that we requested at the beginning of the season. With the exception of a very few "member issues" we have been allowed the opportunity to focus on the important business of managing the club. Thanks to all!

Special thanks to the Fish Fry Committee for donating the 10' x 20' gazebo for the club house deck. Also, to the crew who stepped up to get the gazebo assembled prior to the August 5th Civic Holiday event. We will need some digging done for the gazebo legs and tubes/cement poured to complete the job. Rick Banman will be installing a piece of flashing between the units when the cement is poured and the installation complete. Anyone interested in helping finish this project and in need of work hours please see Dave Courage.

As an update to club business, let me offer the following:

Dock Removal:

Unfortunately, as the season moves on we are planning dock removal based on availability of contractors to remove docks and poles. Kristi has a tentative date of October 14th. Once she has confirmed this she will advise the membership officially and will assign the necessary crew. Please make sure that Kristi has up to date insurance for your boat prior to requesting a lift.

KYC Business Plan and Bylaw Revision:

Although the business plan continues to be progressed, the budget for a barge and associated equipment will limit any other significant activities for the next few years. We will work on the business plan through the winter months once we have firmed up the cost associated with the barge.

The Bylaw edit will be pursued by the Commodore and Executive with the support of Ken Borkwood on behalf of the Advisory Board. We do hope to have this completed this season. Any recommended bylaw revisions from the membership would be appreciated and should be submitted to us via the email address **KYCcommodore1@gmail.com**

Barge:

We have looked at many options so far but as yet are not satisfied with what is available in the marketplace. There was an excellent unit available in Chicago with the right equipment on deck and within budget. Unfortunately it weighed in at 75,000 lbs. Where our lift is limited to < 50,000 lbs it would have to live in a slip for the summer and the well for the winter. We would have to hire a crane at about \$ 1,600 if lifting the barge for repairs or maintenance. At this time we will continue looking for a unit under 50,000 lbs with the desired equipment. We will keep you posted. If anyone sees / hears of an available piece of equipment, please pass it along to Dave Courage, Bill Graves, Mark Miller or Dave Taggart.

In closing, although a seemingly short season with some of the worst weather and limited boating we have had in years, our members did maintain the esprit de corps, and with a little over six weeks to go, we did have a great season sharing stories with old and new friends alike on the wonderful KYC grounds!

The "**Banman Beavers**" took home one of the three metals presented by the parade organizers. Members **Rick and Donna Banman**, and their crew make their way along the harbour.



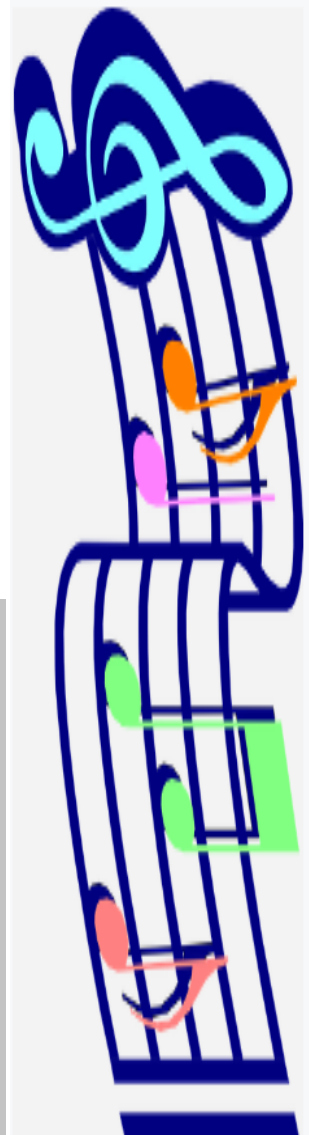

GENERAL MEETING



THE EXECUTIVE PREPARE FOR THEIR PRESENTATIONS, WHILE A LARGE GROUP OF THE MEMBERSHIP WAIT TO HEAR HOW THE CLUB IS DOING FINANCIALLY AND ABOUT MAJOR PLANS FOR THE COMING YEAR.



The July 16th General Meeting was called to order with 36 members and 4 probationary members in attendance. Commodore Bill Graves indicated that the intent of the meeting was to get through the majority of the items in the Officers Reports to permit a more fulsome discussion on the ***Paper Regarding a Barge Purchase***.

Treasurer Mike Blake indicated that the club was in a positive financial position. **Commodore Graves** brought up the displeasure of the membership with Drones buzzing overhead, and the operation of Personal Water Crafts by the two new rental companies at excessive speeds in the creek was being brought to the attention of the operators. **Vice Commodore Ken Gifford** thanked everyone involved in the July 1st weekend activities. Ken said he was looking forward to the upcoming events in August and suggested anyone interested in helping should contact Kim Wood. Ken noted that some ***"Chafing Dishes Have Disappeared!!!!"*** New dishes will be purchased out of the annual operating budget - if you have the old ones please return them. **Rear Commodore Dave Courage** indicated that a temporary line was strung to allow for Internet access. He requested again that the membership have patience with improvements to the internet, material has been purchased and every effort is being made to rectify our internet saga. Again it was noted that you should clean up after yourself, your children and visitors. **Fleet Captain Kristi Metcalf** is researching the purchase of 8-10 end poles for docking and should be available for 2018. New wood poles for the well have been purchased and installed. Kristi indicated that some members had not installed their dock poles, and that expiring insurance should be renewed and provided to the Fleet Captain to prevent having to send out email reminders. **Secretary Lynn Sutherland** brought to the attention of the members that **SHIRTS AND SHOES SHOULD BE WORN WHEN USING THE LIVING AREAS (KITCHEN AND SEATING AREA) WHEN IN THE CLUBHOUSE.** This is a health and safety issue. Members are reminded that during club functions the kitchen is off limits. It was noted that Fish Fry money will be used to purchase two gazebos for the deck. Burgees need to be purchased and once available will be made available to those wishing to replace their existing burgee and given to those who have not yet received one. **Membership Chairman Rick Banman** reported that the club is currently full and that we have 4 individuals on the waiting list. It was noted that the Kanagio web site is up and running. Members please check into the Members Only section, and check out the new KYC clothing line. The Bylaw & Rules and Regulations review continues to take place.

With the retirement of Smitty discussion was had on the pros and cons of the club purchasing our own barge to allow for the installation and removal of our docks and poles. Significant discussion was held and there are a number of issues to be investigated and discussed. However, to make a long story short, **the membership voted to allow creation of a Barge Committee to research the acquisition of a barge for the club, with a purchase price up to \$100,000 subject to acceptable financing being arranged**, hopefully for use in 2018.

The meeting was adjourned with the next General Meeting date Sunday, September 24th at 10 AM.

The annual Port Stanley *Harbourfest* was a resounding success based on the number of visitors to the community over the long weekend. KYC started off the weekend festivities with Hotdogs and Hamburgs on Friday night, followed by a steak bar-be-que on Saturday with live entertainment on the deck. Several members decorated their boats and participated in the evening parade which took place south of the bridge. 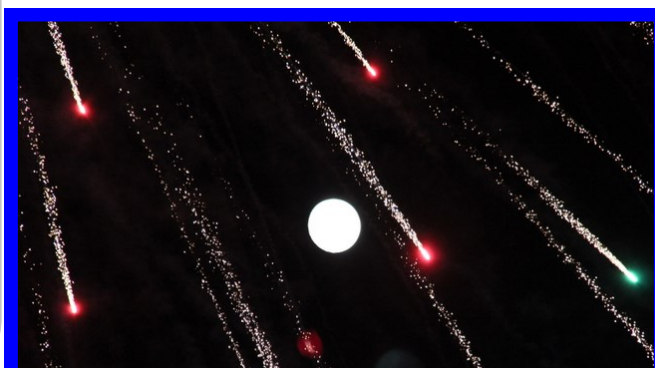

The Committee would not be able to host this event without the participation of all those helping hands. To each of you who gave of your time, your donations, and/or your funds the Committee



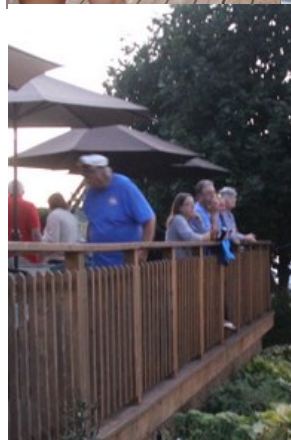
Members breaded the fish, and selling tickets for the Davey Jones Locker. It takes a lot of help to create such a successful event.

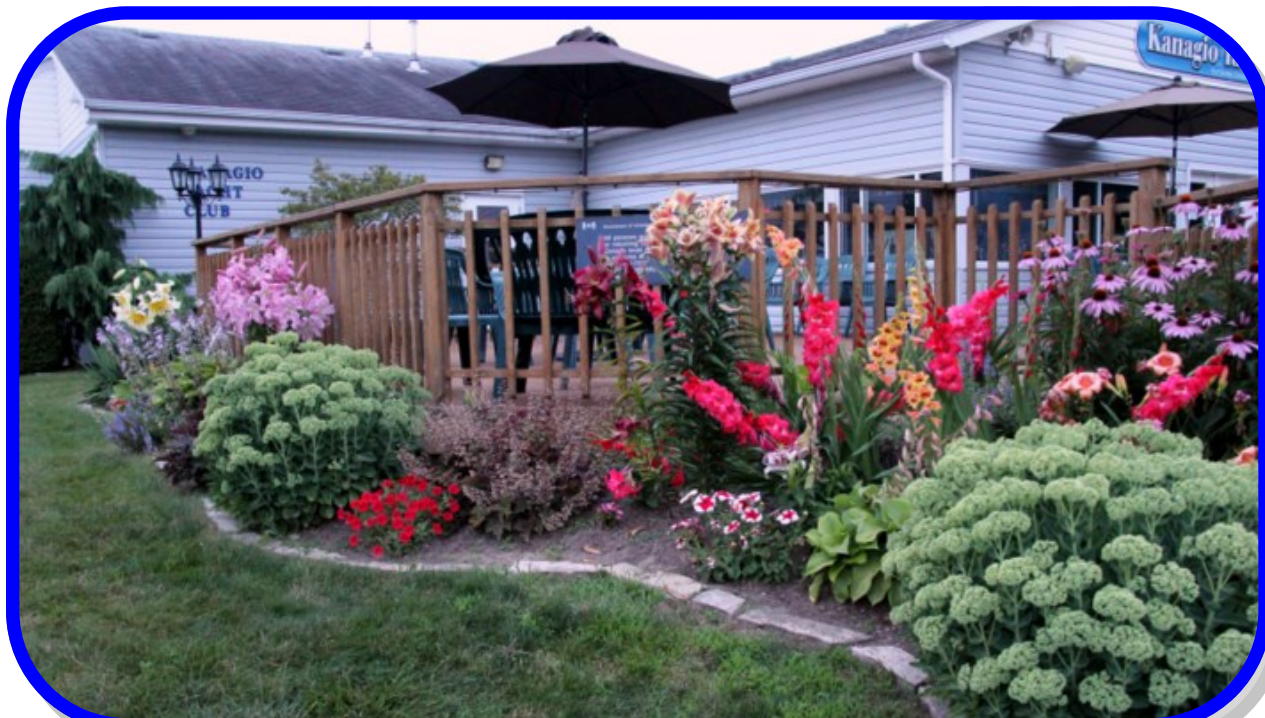


The evening was highlighted by local favourite "SARAH SMITH" and her band who entertained the large crowd until midnight. A great time was had by all those in attendance.

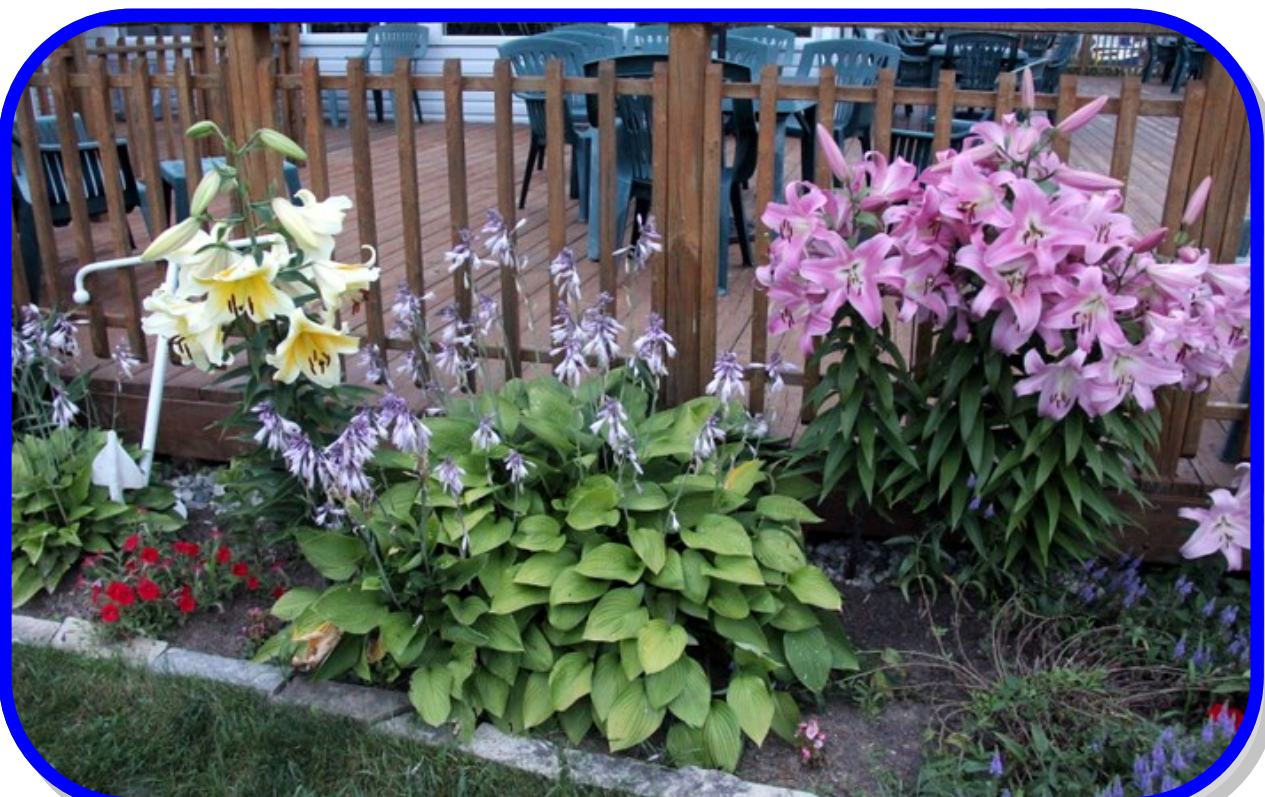


CROWDS GATHERED AROUND THE STAGE AND KYC GROUNDS TO LISTEN TO SARAH; AND HAVE A GOOD TIME



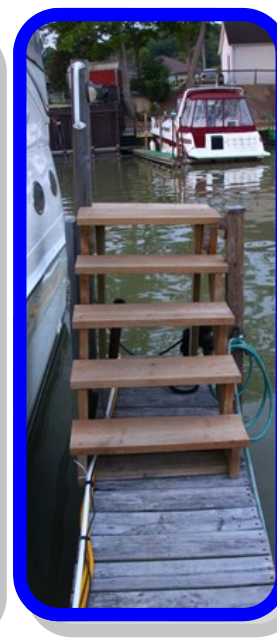
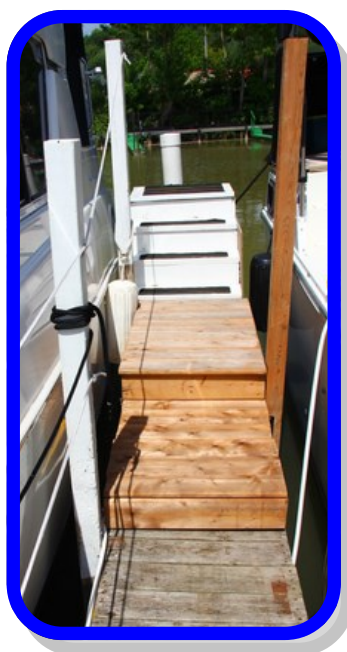
