REX RAND AWARD

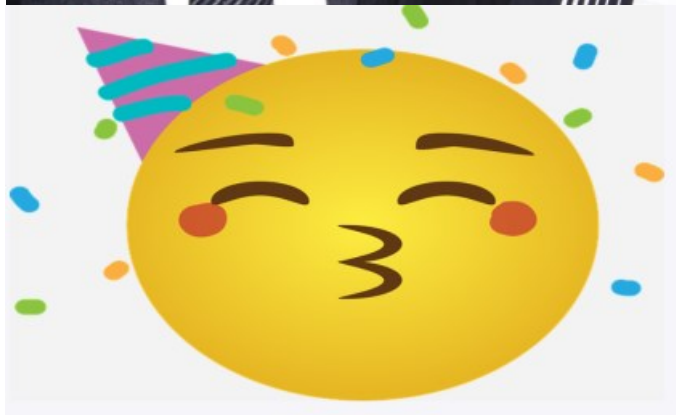

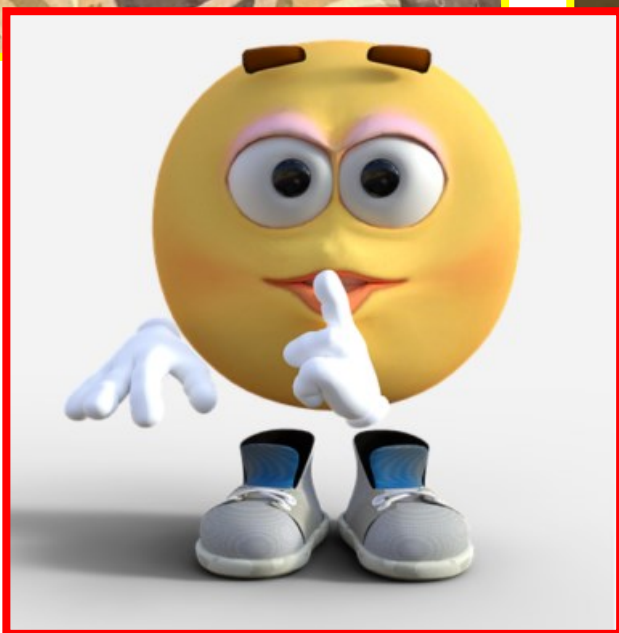






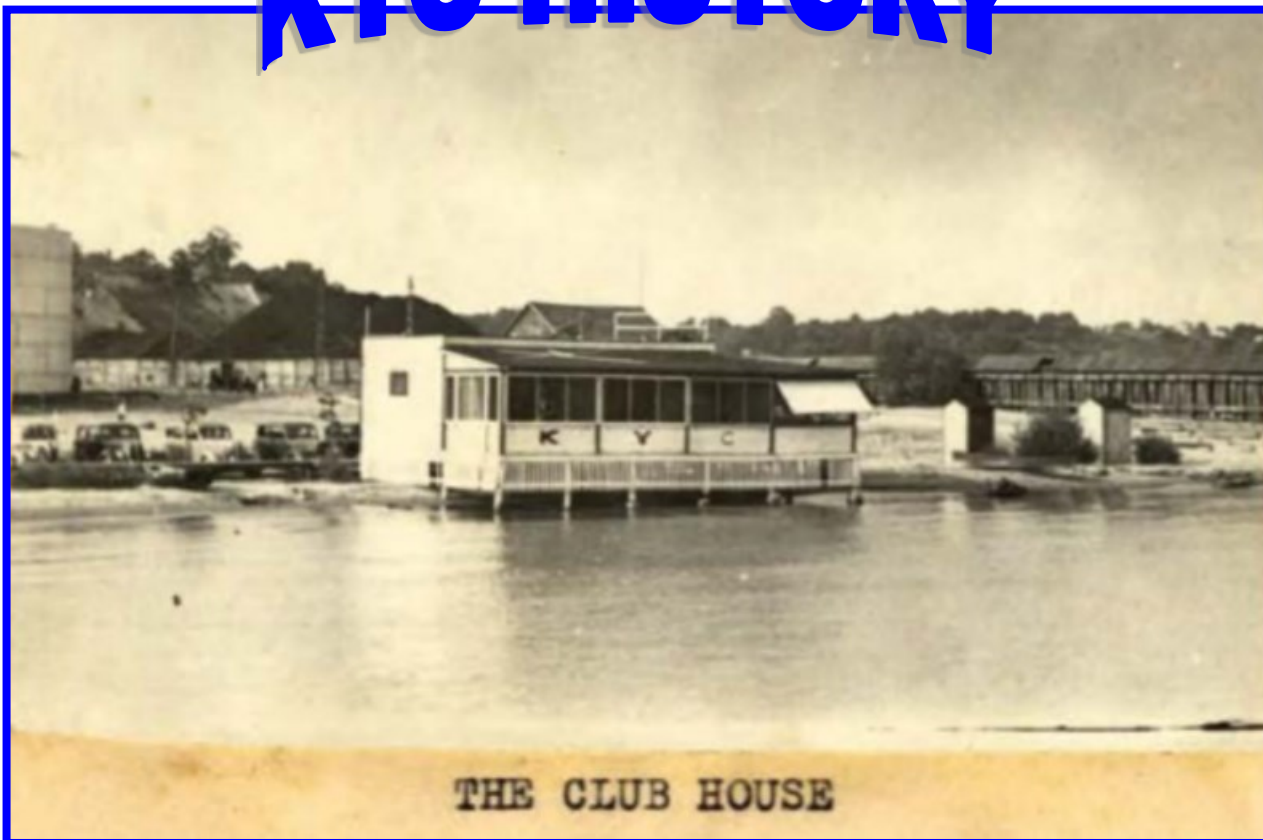

In the Spring of 1937, the club house was moved from the east side of the harbour by water transportation. The new site was L & PS land, just south of the Shell Oil Company. Later it was moved further west on higher ground.
