IMPORTANT REMINDERS GOING INTO 2024

- Volunteer members serve as travel lift operators and fuel committee members. **If fuel is needed, please pre-book** with the designated person on the schedule.
- **Advance notice is crucial when requesting travel lift services.** Contact lift operators well in advance, providing at least a week's notice to arrange a mutually agreeable time and date.
- **Only member boats in good standing with the club will be lifted.** Ensure that insurance is up to date with the Fleet Captain, and accounts are current regarding dues, penalties, or initiation payments.
- **The Fleet Captain maintains the NO LIFT list**, beyond the control of lift operators. If your name appears on the list after arranging a lift in advance, there is ample time to resolve issues with the Fleet and Treasurer as necessary.
- Upon being lifted, it is expected that the next task is to clean up and store stands and blocking.
- **Cradles must be stored as directed by the Rear and Fleet as soon as the boat is launched**, a responsibility managed by tractors and hand carts, not travel lift operators.
- All shrink wrap must be taken to the designated area and prepared for collection by the recycling company. NO SHRINK WRAP is allowed in the garbage bin. Appliances are also prohibited and are the member's responsibility to dispose of OFF SITE.
- **Recycled/used oil should be deposited in the tank at the South yard.** Only oil is allowed; no other fluids.
- **The South Yard is designated for the neat and tidy storage of winter storage materials.** It is not for miscellaneous items; spare boxes, tables, and other belongings are not allowed.
- **Tractors will be stored in the garage.** Trailers and the Honey Wagon can be stored outside, keeping the garage open for maintenance projects when the space beside the garage is available.
- **Manage helpers and guests responsibly**, from allowing their entry, signing them in per the bylaws, directing them to a guest parking area, to being accountable for their conduct.
- **Do not share your key fob.** These guidelines are common-sense reminders based on frequent feedback. Please review and understand your responsibilities under the bylaws and regulations of KYC, considering the law, fellow members, and joint liabilities.
- **Member visitors are not allowed to bring dogs onto the site.** Members with dogs please respect your neighbours and for sure clean up after your dog, the geese and bad enough.



DREDGING

The increasing silting along the members' slips had reached a critical point, necessitating the club's decision to undertake dredging of the creek. Given the limited options for contractors experienced in handling such tasks on Kettle Creek, a local firm was chosen for the job. Remarkably, they not only completed the assignment in a remarkably short time but also left the site in excellent condition. This marked a significant improvement over the last dredging effort, and the costs came in well below the initial estimates.

As the boats were launched into the water in spring, there was a noticeable difference – ample water under the hulls and propellers, bringing satisfaction to all members. This successful dredging project not only addressed the immediate issue of silting but also showcased the club's commitment to efficient management of its facilities for the benefit of all.

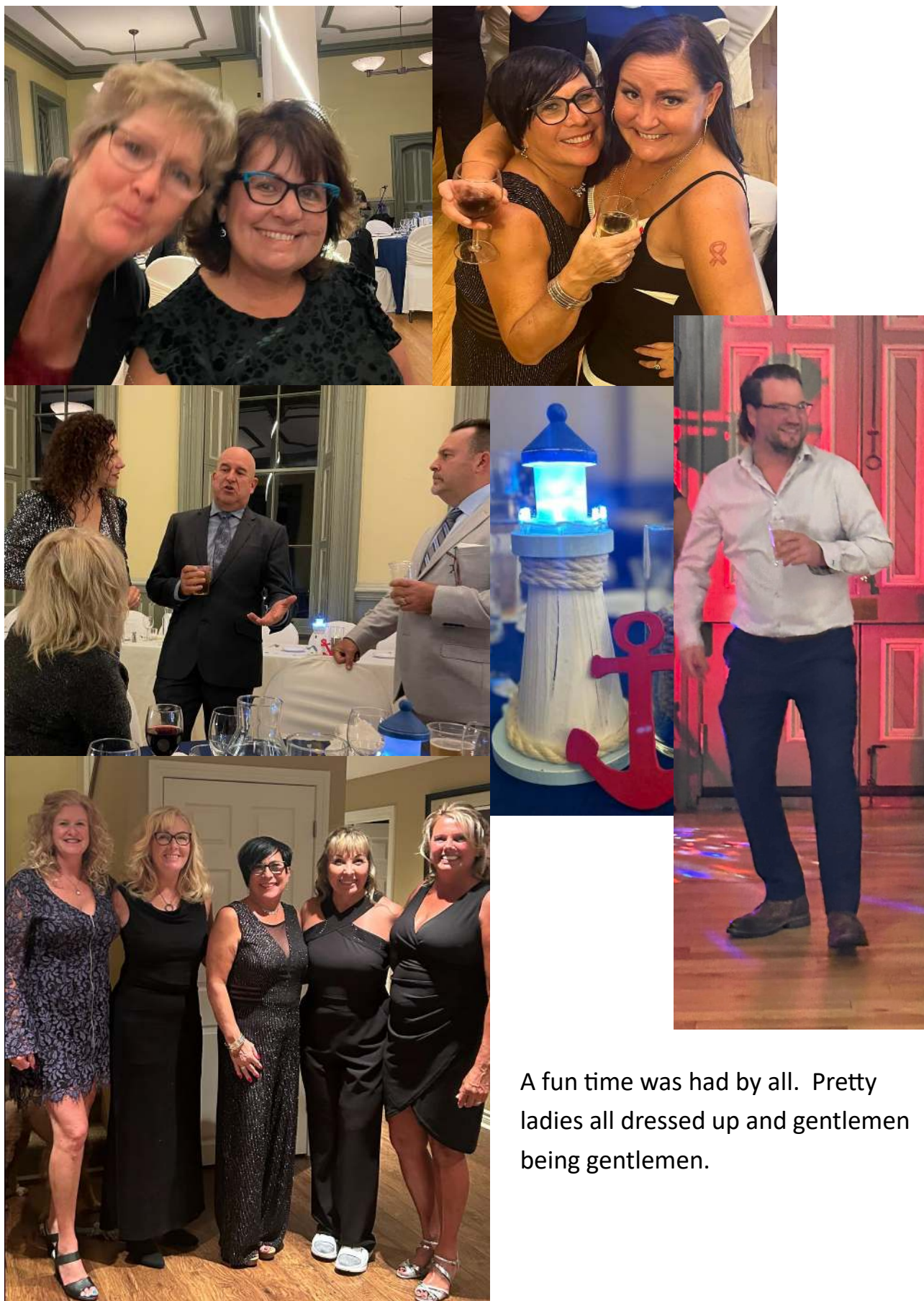
Bob has been a member of KYC since July 2005. During this time period Bob has always been prepared to offer a helping hand with projects around the club.
